Giving Nest New Years Resolutions

The arrival of 2025 will be celebrated at the Giving Nest with noisemakers and confetti. Each class will be challenged with a new skill to accomplish in 2025

- The Ducklings will begin getting their own coats at the end of the day and putting
 them on without help. They will use the preschool method of laying the coats on
 the ground and putting their arms in the sleeves and flipping the coats over their
 heads.
- The Bluebirds and Cardinals will begin zippering or buttoning their own coats and putting on their hats and gloves all by themselves.

The teachers have certificates to present to the children when they have successfully mastered the skill. Look for this in your child's backpack. Please note these are important skills to develop at your child's age. If he or she is having trouble please practice his/her classes' selected skill at home. Several of the children in each age group may have already mastered these skills, which is great. They will receive a certificate once they demonstrate the skill for the teacher.

Slipper and Pajama Day

During the cozy month of January each class will have PAJAMAS & SLIPPER DAY either on January 8th or 9th. Please check your class calendars for the correct dates. On PJ's/Slipper day, please have your child wear their PJ's and send a pair of slippers to school, placed in your child's backpack. During the day we will talk about cozy times in the winter. We will serve "semi" hot chocolate with marshmallows and whipped cream.

Manner of the Month

Starting January 2025 we will choose a different manner each month to discuss during Sing. In January we explain that is polite to listen quietly and not interrupt when someone is speaking. The Directors will tell the children that when someone is talking and you want to speak, the polite thing to do is wait until the person is done and then you can speak. We will



demonstrate this by playacting with other staff members and students. Next we will explain that sometimes we may have to interrupt; for example if you really have to go to the bathroom or someone needs help. In these situations it is polite to interrupt the conversation by saying, "Excuse me'. The teachers will demonstrate these two situations during sing. Throughout the month we will have volunteer students come up at sing and demonstrate when to wait for a stop in the conversation or when to use the polite word "excuse me."

During this lesson a few years ago a very observant student mentioned that sometimes children are too short and if two adults are talking they might not see a small child; and that child could wait a very long time for there to be a stop in conversation. Taking this into account we started something new at The Giving Nest and it works beautifully. If a child wants to tell the teacher something and the teacher is engaged in conversation with another child or adult the child gently touches the teacher and waits patiently. The teacher gently touches the child to let him know she is aware he is waiting to speak. The teacher then finishes her sentence and addresses the child waiting. The children and teachers loved this! Many of the parents continued this practice at home and were very pleased with how well it

Progress Reports & Parent Teacher Conferences

We ask you to pre-register so we can determine if we need a lottery or an adjustment to meet all our In-house students' needs. Then we will call the many families that have applications on file. So if you have not pre-registered we cannot guarantee you a spot for next year. FLU SHOT REMINDER- VERY IMPORTANT

Influenza Vaccine: Children 6 months through 59 months attending any childcare or preschool facility must annually receive at least one dose of influenza vaccine between

September 1 & December 31 each year. It is very important you comply with this state mandate. The state sends a nurse to the preschools to check each child's medical paper work and ascertain all shots have been administered. If shots are not up to date the child may have to leave the school. The nurse checks all immunizations.
